

4.0 Support / Clinical Facilities

Goal 1: To Provide Sufficient Facilities for Student Services, Administrative, Physical Plant, Clinical, Auxiliary and Other Non-Instructional Functions that Support the University’s Teaching, Research and Extension Mission.

Objective 1.0: Provide support facilities consistent with the academic support needs of the University and in accordance with applicable space standards and customer expectations.

Policy 1.1.1: The Facilities Planning and Construction Division shall maintain a current inventory of support space, and evaluate space utilization and occupancy consistent with the Educational Plant Survey requirements of Chapter 1013.31, Florida Statutes.	Ongoing	FPC (now PDC) maintains the space data inventory and complies with all state reporting requirements including the Educational Plant Survey.	Modify – reference support space in both Support/Clinical and Cultural FLU
Policy 1.1.2: The location of support facilities shall be consistent with the Future Land Use map, Figure 2-1 and Future Building Sites map, Figure 13-1.	Ongoing	Support facilities have been located consistent with the campus master plan FLU and Future Building Sites designations.	Modify – reference support/clinical and cultural facilities
Policy 1.1.3: Support facilities that serve primarily students shall be conveniently located in proximity to academic areas, student housing and transit facilities to maximize accessibility.	Ongoing	Support services serving students have been located consistent with this policy as evidenced in projects such as the Student Counseling and Wellness Center and food service expansions.	Retain
Policy 1.1.4: Support facilities that attract the general public and/or have minimal interaction with students should locate on the campus perimeter adjacent to parking and transit facilities, or in off-campus locations, or at the Eastside Campus on Waldo Road to maximize accessibility.	Ongoing	Support services meeting these criteria have been located consistent with this policy as evidenced in projects such as the East Campus Office Building, Florida Surgical Center and Dasburg President’s House.	Modify – reference support/clinical and cultural facilities; correct East Campus name

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Policy 1.1.5: Patient clinics shall be designed to effectively and efficiently treat patients in environments that adapt to changing patient care technologies and promote healing through innovative design utilizing natural light, comfortable furnishings and appropriate colors.	Ongoing	Patient clinics are designed consistent with this policy.	Retain
Policy 1.1.6: Begin to develop a student support services cluster north of Radio Road and east of SW 34 th Street consistent with the Future Land Use map, and convenient to student housing and recreation facilities.	Ongoing	Support services have been located consistent with this policy as evidenced by the Student Counseling and Wellness Center.	Retain – consider removing limitation to “student” support services
Policy 1.1.7: P. K. Yonge Developmental Laboratory School shall examine its space needs and develop a program and funding plan for building renovation and replacement necessary to maintain K-12 space requirements.	In Progress	A master redevelopment plan was developed for PKY Developmental Laboratory School in 2007. The Elementary building was constructed as the first phase of implementing this plan.	Modify – reflect that the analysis and planning is complete; implementation is ongoing
Policy 1.1.8: The Physical Plant Division shall initiate a study to explore opportunities to increase space efficiency within the compound area north of Radio Road and to decentralize some functions elsewhere on- or off-campus.	Not Completed	While some consolidations have taken place within this area of campus and the nursery has been abandoned, no comprehensive study has been initiated.	Retain
Policy 1.1.9: The University shall explore the potential to relocate and consolidate facilities from the Civil and Coastal Engineering site on SW 6 th Street to the Eastside Campus on Waldo Road thus creating the opportunity to re-establish this SW 6 th Street area in a support land use.	In Progress	The 2015-2025 update of the Campus Master Plan proposes adaptive reuse of the facilities at SW 6 th Street in an academic support function.	Delete
